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The Global Partnership for the Prevention of Armed Conflict (GPPAC) is a member-led network of civil society organisations working on conflict prevention and peacebuilding around the world. Our mission is to promote a global shift from solely reacting to conflicts to preventing them from turning violent. We bring together different actors - civil society, decision makers, academia and media - to find peaceful solutions to conflict.

GPPAC's approach

GPPAC informs policy by connecting civil society with key decision makers at the national, regional and global level. As a network of peacebuilders, we analyse conflicts from a human security perspective, we build knowledge and develop collaborative mechanisms to prevent violent conflict.

GPPAC enables collaboration between civil society organisations and with other actors to analyse trends and improve longterm peacebuilding strategies to foster joint action. We support organisations based in conflictaffected countries, and in politically sensitive contexts where official channels of communication and interaction are limited or absent. We enable collaborative projects that aim to prevent conflict and build sustainable peace. **GPPAC improves practice** through learning exchanges on conflict prevention, involving civilsociety practitioners, state institutions, UN representatives, regional organisations and other key actors. We document lessons learned, develop resources and support trainings, highlighting the role of civil society in topics such as:

- Conflict analysis
- Dialogue and mediation
- Peace and conflict resolution education
- Gender-sensitive approaches
- Civil-military-police coordination for human security

What we do

Since 2003, GPPAC has been bringing the voices of local peacebuilders to the UN Peacebuilding Commission. We work to make the commission more inclusive and transparent and lobby for its engagement in preventive peacebuilding activities.

GPPAC has created a community of practice on regional organisations and civil society cooperation for conflict prevention. It brings together representatives from twelve regional organisations, the UN and civil society and promotes policy dialogues at the global and regional levels.

GPPAC's 25 Gender Focal Points advise the network and advocate on gender-sensitive conflict prevention.
